BRUSH AND COMPOST PILES:

We have areas by the RLMC office to take your brush and compost when you do your fall cleanup. Just follow the signs and put the debris on the designated piles. Also there is a sign at the brush pile stating what can be put on that pile. Please no big logs or stumps on the brush pile. Also do not put mulch or wood chips on that pile and please don't put any trash on either pile.

Winter level should be reached by November 15th (depending on the weather)

INSIDE BOAT STORAGE:

We put the boats in inside storage on a first come, first serve basis. We don't reserve spots. We do fill the barns so get your boats in early. We will have 2 days in the spring to take them out. The first Saturday of May (4th) and the third Saturday of May (18th). ALL BOATS WILL BE TAKEN OUT ON THESE DATES. When you bring your boat to store, you need to choose one of these dates on the boat Storage Slip.

We will be putting boats away on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday nights. After September 21st, we will be putting them away more frequently. You can drop your boat off behind the office (building #5) anytime. You can get a storage slip from the office, website, or from the cabinet on the fence by the gate to the outside storage area.

YOU NEED TO MAKE SURE YOU HAVE A TAG ON YOUR BOAT WITH YOUR NAME AND PHONE NUMBER ON IT. MAKE SURE YOU HAVE YOUR SLIP FILLED OUT AND PUT BACK IN THE CABINET. YOU CAN PUT YOUR CHECK MADE OUT TO RLMC IN THE DROP BOX BY THE OFFICE. IF YOU ARE NEW AND ARE UNSURE WHAT TO DO, CONTACT ONE OF THE BOAT STORAGE COMMITEE PEOPLE ON THE LIST.

All fees are due at time of storage. Payments in cash need to be taken to the office when the office is open. Only property owners in good standing will be allowed to store items in storage. RLMC is not responsible for lost or damaged property stored on corporation property. Please obtain your own insurance.

OUTSIDE BOAT STORAGE:

All outside storage at the boat storage area is FREE. All items stored outside, must be tagged with your name, phone number, and a slip filled out with the description of item stored. Items stored must have a current registration or license plate. ALSO THESE ITEMS MUST BE TAKEN OUT OF THE STORAGE AREA AT LEAST ONCE A YEAR! Tags and slips are available at the main gate entrance or at the office. To get an item into the outside storage area you need to contact one of the members on the boat storage committee (see list above), or stop at the office during office hours.

PONTOON TRAILERS:

Also as a reminder, the lake has two pontoon trailers available for use free of charge. Please use the lights and keep your travel to a radius of 25 miles. PLEASE REMEMBER TO SIGN OUT THE TRAILER ON THE TRAILER LOG THAT IS IN THE CABINET ON THE FENCE. ALSO IF YOU NEED THE TRAILER OVER NIGHT, LET SOMEONE ON THE BOAT STORAGE COMMITTEE KNOW.
